





Technical Bulletin for: **Ponderosa Pine Tip Moth**

Rhyacionia zozana (Kearfott) • Lepidoptera, Tortricidae • RHYZOZ



DISTRIBUTION	Oregon, Washington, California
HOSTS	Ponderosa Pine, other pines within its range
DESCRIPTION	
Adult Moth	Reddish-brown with silver gray markings.
Larvae	Mature larvae are yellow to pale brown, with dark heads.
Eggs	Very small, Yellowish-brown in color.
LIFE HISTORY	Species has a 1-year life cycle, overwinters as pupae in cocoons. Adults begin to emerge in January. Larvae feed on elongating shoots from April through July.

MONITORING INFORMATION

LURE ACTIVE INGREDIENTS, SUBSTRATE & FIELD LIFE	E-9-12Ac and Z-9-12Ac on a red rubber septum. Lure longevity: Thirty (30) days.	
TRAP TO USE	Red Paper or Plastic Delta Trap or Wing Trap	
MONITORING STRATEGY	Hang traps near affected trees. Check with local Forestry Service for further information and recommendations.	
CULTURAL & PHYSICAL CONTROL	No cultural or physical information available.
