

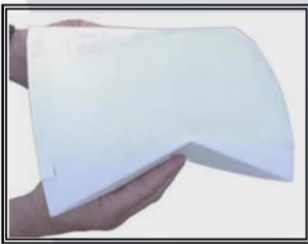


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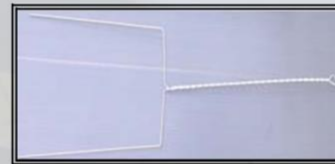
## Wing Trap

### Assembly and Use Instructions

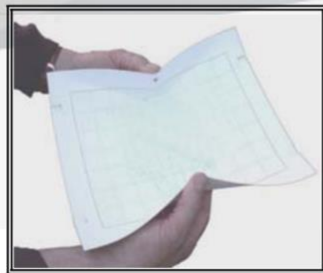
- Fold top inward along each of the four diagonal creases (Picture 1).
- Unbend the wire hanger so that it looks like Picture 2. Insert the ends through the holes in trap top. Thread ends through holes in side panels from the inside and push the wire hanger down as far as it will go. Slide a spacer onto each end of the wire. Do not use spacers for codling moth.
- Remove release paper from sticky bottom in one continuous motion. With sticky side up, fold the side panels of trap bottom inward (Picture 3).
- Insert wire ends through holes in side panels of the bottom from the outside, then thread through the lower holes from the inside (Picture 4). Slide the trap bottom up snug to the spacers. Bend the end of the wire upward to hold it all in place.
- Place lure in center of trap bottom.



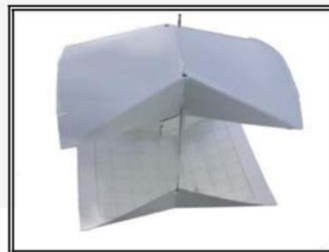

Use instructions:

- Hang trap by wrapping the twisted end of wire hanger securely around tree limb or other support.
- Change the lure every 4 weeks (every 8 weeks for a long-life lure).
- Change the trap bottom when it is saturated with insects or other material.
